JESUS' BEATITUDES AND THE INFLUENCE OF CHRISTIANS

Text: Matthew 5:13-16

Introduction:

- 1. The biblically blessed are those who depend upon God.
- 2. They inherit the promise made to Abraham by submission to God.
- 3. Jesus begins the Sermon on the Mount by describing foundational attitudes that are necessary to follow Him.
- 4. These attitudes are essential to salvation.
- 5. They are also essential to having a godly influence in a wicked world.
- 5. Consider the relationship between the beatitudes of Jesus and the influence of Christians...

I. The Influence of Salt

- A. The importance of salt:
 - 1. Salt is essential to human life.
 - 2. Salt has preserving power.
 - 3. Salt has a seasoning effect.
- B. The Christian is necessary for propagating spiritual life.
 - 1. The Christian is to have the heart of a peacemaker (5:9)
 - 2. Evangelism (Mark 16:15-16; Romans 10:14-15)
 - 3. Explanation (Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 8:30-31, 35)
 - 4. Example (Acts 9:36; Hebrews 10:24-25; 1 Peter 2:12; 3:1)
- C. The Christian is necessary for spiritual preservation (cf. Genesis 18:23ff; 19:29; 39:5; Proverbs 14:34; Acts 27:4).
- D. The Christian is necessary for spiritual flavor (Colossians 4:6).

II. The Influence of Light

- A. Darkness is the absence of light.
- B. The Christian reflects Jesus, the Light of the World (John 8:12; 9:5; 12:46; Philippians 1:20).
- C. The Christian holds forth the light of Truth (Matthew 10:27; 2 Corinthians 4:4; Philippians 2:15-16).
- D. The Christian shines forth the light of righteousness (2 Corinthians 6:14; Ephesians 5:8-14).
- E. The church is a city of light set upon a hill (Revelation 1:20; 2:1).

III. The Influence Diminished

- A. Salt that has lost its ability to preserve or season is worthless.
- B. A light hidden under a basket is useless.
- C. Christians must strive to maintain their influence for good (2 Peter 2:20-22; Hebrews 6:4-6; etc.).

Conclusion: The Beatitudes allow one to have a godly influence in the world.
