JESUS' BEATITUDES AND THE LAW OF CHRIST

Text: Matthew 5:17 – 6:18

Introduction:

A.

- 1. The biblically blessed are those who depend upon God.
- 2. They inherit the promise made to Abraham by submission to God.
- Jesus begins the Sermon on the Mount by describing foundational attitudes that 3. are necessary to follow Him.
- These attitudes are essential to salvation and to having a godly influence. 4.
- They are also essential for submitting to and obeying the Law of Christ. 5.
- I. Proper Attitude Toward the Old Law
 - (5:17-20)Jesus did not destroy the Law of Moses; instead, He fulfilled it.
 - "Destroy" means, "Demolish, tear down, or destroy." 1.
 - "Abolish" means, "To render idle or inactive; to deprive of force; 2. to annul" (Ephesians 2:15).
 - 3. Jesus fulfilled the prophecies, purpose, and goal of the Old Law superseding it with His New Law (Hebrews 8:7-13).
 - Yet, while He lived, the Old Law was still in effect; thus, men were to B. obey it.
 - C. However, it was to be kept with a proper attitude of heart - not selfrighteousness.
- II. Proper Attitude Under the Old Law

(5:21-48)

- They had heard legalism and self-righteousness from the traditions of A. men.
- B. The Law of Moses demanded obedience from the heart.
- C. Jesus went even further to demonstrate the need for submission based upon a desire to be like the Father.
- III. Proper Attitude to Follow the New Law (6:1-18)
 - Obedience without pride (vs. 1-4) A.
 - Obedience without hypocrisy (vs. 5-8) B.
 - C. Obedience without conceit (vs. 9-15)
 - Obedience without falsehood (vs. 16-18) D.

Conclusion:

- 1. The attitudes needed to follow the Law of Christ are founded in the Beatitudes.
- 2. Humility, meekness, and a hunger for righteousness will produce genuine obedience.
- 3. A heart that seeks mercy, purity, and peace will submit in every way to the will of God.
- 4. Such a person will obey the Lord even when threatened with persecution.
