# JESUS' BEATITUDES AND THE PRIORITIES OF LIFE

Text: Matthew 6:19-34

Introduction:

- 1. The biblically blessed are those who depend upon God.
- 2. They inherit the promise made to Abraham by submission to God.
- 3. Jesus begins the Sermon on the Mount by describing foundational attitudes that are necessary to follow Him.
- 4. These attitudes are essential to salvation, to having a godly influence, and to obeying the Law of Christ.
- 5. They are also essential for submitting to having proper priorities in life.
- I. Where Is Your Treasure?

### (6:19-21)

- A. A disciple with a proper attitude will keep priorities in perspective.
- B. The Christian must not allow earthly treasures to become his priority.
  - 1. To trust in wealth is to deny God (Job 31:24-28; Deuteronomy 8:10-14; Luke 18:24; 1 Timothy 6:8ff; 1 John 2:15-17).
  - 2. Riches cannot satisfy (Ecclesiastes 5:10-14).
  - 3. Riches cannot stay (Proverbs 23:5; ).
  - 4. Riches cannot save (Psalm 49:6-9; Proverbs 11:4; Ezekiel 7:19; Zephaniah 1:18; James 5:1-3; Matthew 16:26; Luke 12:19-21; 16:22-23).
- C. Instead, his focus must be on that which endures forever treasure in Heaven (Matthew 19:21; Luke 12:33; Hebrews 10:34; 11:26; James 2:5; 1 Peter 1:4; 5:4; Revelation 2:9).
- D. One's priorities determine one's actions!
- II. What Is Your Focus?

## (6:22-23)

- A. A singleness of focus on righteousness brings light.
- B. A focus on evil (whether single or double) brings darkness.
  - 1. Obviously, one with a single focus on evil will be and do evil.
  - 2. But, one who tries to focus on both good and evil will also become evil.
- C. The Christian must strive to keep his focus always on that which is right (cf. Matthew 20:13-15; 23:16-28; Ephesians 4:18; 1 John 2:11).
- D. Consider the illustration of a man walking a tightrope: to make it safely across he must keep his eye on the goal.

## III. Who Is Your Master?

- A. It is impossible to serve two masters and be pleasing to both.
- B. Likewise, the Christian must not try to serve both God and the flesh.
- C. In fact, there is no need to serve the material realm at all, for God will provide the necessities of life.
- D. To serve God first (by putting His kingdom and righteousness first) is the priority of life.
